The past week

It was out into the Tree Trust Reserve on Saturday when 38 ran over varying distances and terrain, starting and finishing on the corner of Moncur and Old Taupo Roads green area.

The main event (7.00km) is where the trophies were contested. To arrive at the winners of the trophies is where club handicapper Moustache comes into the picture. He deducts from the time a person completes the course, his pre-determined handicap. The person with the lowest time wins the trophy relating to the category they fall into. All very confusing but it works! The trophies at stake and how they are won are below.

- The Novice Cup presented June 1947 by Mr H K Taylor is awarded to a person who has been a financial Club member 2 years or less.
- The Veteran Cup presented in 1953 by an A Mayne is awarded to a person aged 35 plus and is a financial member in excess of 2 years.
- The Costello Cup presented by WJ Costello in August 1947 is awarded to a financial member that does not fall into either of the above categories.

When these trophies were originally presented, the Costello Cup was a stand-alone event, so was the Novice Cup until the Veteran trophy came onto the scene in 1954. All three were combined in 1979 and are now held on the same day. Why? To reduce the number of races on the winter calendar.

Some may be interested in where the races went in their heyday.

- The Costello Rose Bowl in 1947, left from the Government Gardens tennis pavilion and headed across the sulphur flats to Ngapuna, down Vaughan Road, across the main road (Te Ngae) over the paddocks to sweep across to the gravel pit (in the region of where our clubrooms are) to return via the sulphur flats. The trophy was awarded on a sealed handicap basis as it is today.
- The Novice cup in 1947 left from Victoria Street and proceeded up Fenton Street, past the golf course, up Mokoia Drive, across the top (Sloane Avenue), (these roads would have been in the countryside in those days and possibly only dirt) across the countryside to Otonga Road (in those days dirt or metal), right into Horohoro Road (now Springfield Road), into Old Taupo Road to Ranolf Street and then right into Victoria Street to the finish. This trophy was originally awarded to a club member that had never won a winter season race either within the Club or in open competition, and on a sealed handicap basis as it is today.
- Little history on the Veteran Rose Bowl can be found, other than it was presented in 1953 and to be contested on the same day as the Novice Cup. Records show that in 1956 it left H K Taylor's residence in Horohoro Road and the trophy was originally awarded to a club member that had won a winter season race either within the Club or in open competition. Again, on a sealed handicap basis, as it is today.

Club Patron, Graeme Dennett and his family hosted the Novice, Veteran and Costello event from 1972 to around the late 1999s. From then on, our current host, Peter Vyver has made

his property available to the Club. As the years have rolled on there has been many venues and courses, but that's another story.

Last, but not the least, thanks are extended to our host of the day, Peter Vyver, those that marked the course on Friday evening, those that dismantled it Saturday post event, and those who looked after the finish line. Results are at the end of the publication.



2021 New Zealand Road Relays

Note when your deposit needs to be paid and how to do so - time is running out!

This event will be held on Saturday October 2 from Christchurch on the iconic Takahe to Akaroa course. Lake City Athletic Club is looking to send up to six teams to this event. It is open to <u>ALL</u> club members aged over 14 years old. To be eligible for a team a club member will need to:

- Register as a club member (at least social membership) by 31/05/21.
- Pay a \$200 deposit to the club by 31/05/21 (see DEPOSIT INSTRUCTIONS below).
- Compete in selection races during the cross-country and road season (see the Lake City winter season programme).
